The AIA Triangle Awards Program includes two types of awards. The **AIA Triangle Design Award** will be given to architects in recognition of design excellence. The **AIA Triangle Isosceles Award** will be given in recognition of our area Partners who have worked with the AIA Triangle community to construct a better built environment. The Awards Reception is \$35 before April 14th and \$45 after April 14th. The price for students is \$20. 2009 AIA Triangle Design Award



Purpose Statement

The purpose of the AIA Triangle Design Award is to recognize and encourage exceptional designs in the field of architecture and executed by members of AIA Triangle.

Eligibility

Eligible entries must be authored by a member or associate member of AIA Triangle. Entries can have any location, but the design must have been executed in an AIA Triangle member office. An entrant may enter one or more submissions.

Designs that have received recognition in previous Isosceles and AIA Triangle Design Awards programs are not eligible. "Unbuilt" award winning projects that have been constructed may be resubmitted.

Built Projects must have been completed on or after 1 January 2003. Unbuilt Projects include projects not yet completed but scheduled to be under construction in 2009. These entries must have been commissioned for compensation by clients with the means and intention to execute the proposed design.

Submissions

Project types include but are not limited to: BUILT, UNBUILT COMMISSIONED, INTERIORS, PRESERVATION/RENOVATION and DETAILS. All entries for this category will be judged on the basis of their architectural design excellence. It is the intention of the AIA Triangle Design Awards program to promote design irrespective of project type. The jurors will be asked to consider important issues/challenges particular to each project type, but all entries will be judged collectively.

The jury will decide the number of awards to be given and whether to confer Honor or Merit awards. No Honorable Mention awards will be given.

Certificates for all award winning entries will be presented at the awards reception. It is important to have a representative from the winning firm present to accept the award. Winners will receive three certificates: one for the architect, one for the owner and one for the contractor. Additional certificates will be available at the expense of the award recipient.

Registration/Submission Requirements

1. Registration deadline is Friday, 6 February 2009

To register for this awards program the entrant must use the Registration Form attached herewith. The completed registration form and a check for the entry fee should be mailed to AIA Triangle. The entry fee is \$150 for each project entered. The late entry fee is \$200 for each project entered. Make checks payable to "AIA Triangle." Please include "2009 Design Awards" in memo line. Entry fees are non-refundable.

2. Entry submission deadline is Monday, 09 March 2009.

Any prompt method of delivery is acceptable. Mail-in entries must show postmark or other evidence of being en route by midnight 09 March 2009. Hand-delivered entries must be received by end of business day, 09 March 2009.

3. Each entry submission must include:

- Entry Display Binder with
 - Entry Description Form
 - Concealed Credits Form
- CD-ROM with Submittal Images
- Public Display Board

4. Entries must consist of legibly reproduced graphic material and text adequate to explain the project. All entries must be submitted in a standard 8 1/2 x 11 black presentation binder with 6 top loading polypropylene pockets (12 front and back views) and insertable front cover.



Please do not use a 3 ring binder. No single entry is to exceed 12 views, though fewer than 12 views is allowed.

5. A form is provided herewith that will be your **Entry Description Form**. Please place the completed form in the pocket on the front cover of the presentation binder. The format provided must be used without the addition of any photographs, drawings, lines or color.

6. Two additional forms are provided and are to be completed in their entirety and signed: A **Concealed Credits Form** and a **Photo Release Form**. Please insert the completed forms into one unsealed #10 envelope and attach it to the inside back cover of submission binder. Information for publicity and certificates will be taken from these forms. To maintain anonymity, no names of entrants or collaborating parties may appear on any part of the submission binder, except on the Concealed Credits Form.

The Photo Release Form will serve as confirmation of the copyright holder's agreement that the photographs identified or described below may be submitted for this design competition and outlines uses that may be made of the images.

7. Each entry must include a separate **CD-ROM with a copy of each image used in the submissions binder**. These images will be used for public display in print and digital format. Each image must be suitable for digital display [JPEG, GIF, or PNG and maximum resolution of 72 dpi and size of 300x300 pixels]. One image should be chosen as the Public Image and be suitable for printing [TIFF or EPS and minimum 300dpi].

The CD-ROM should be submitted in a clear jewel case or protective sleeve with the name of the design being submitted clearly identified on the CD and jewel case. All CDROMs will be retained by AIA Triangle as part of the awards program archives.

8. Each entry must also include a Public Display Board measuring 16" x 16". This board is to have only one image and must include project name, firm name, location, and photographer credit if applicable. This image will be considered the image for publication. Boards are to be dry mounted on 3/16" black gator board. The Boards will be on display at the Awards Reception and Lecture and other public venues thereafter.

NOTE: To insure project anonymity the Awards Jury will only have access to the Entry Display Binder and not the Public Image or Public Display Board.

Original drawings are not required and the AIA Triangle will accept no liability for them. The Design Awards Committee and AIA Triangle intend to return entries intact, but can assume no liability for loss or damage.

Exhibition / Publicity

The AIA Triangle Awards Committee intends to publish the entries receiving awards. All entries will be posted to the AIA Triangle web site using the public image provided. The Project Boards will be on display at the Awards Reception and Lecture. Afterwards, all entries will be a part of a travelling exhibit to be displayed in local public settings in the Triangle area throughout the year. In 2008, the venues included the Raleigh Urban Design Center, the State Legislative Office Building, the Raleigh Convention Center, the Halle Cultural Arts Center, Clayton Center, Cary Town Hall, and the Durham Arts Council.

It is therefore essential that drawings and photographs not be restricted against publication. It is the entrant's responsibility to clear all drawings and photographs for release by the AIA Triangle Awards Committee which will assume no responsibility for copyrights or photographic fees. The photographs for each award winning entry will be used for unrestricted newspaper, magazine, and website publicity. Credit must be given to the photographer by the entrant.

2009 AIA Triangle Isosceles Award



Purpose Statement

The AIA Triangle Isosceles Award is to recognize individuals, institutions, associations, or companies outside the profession of architecture who, in collaboration with AIA Triangle members, have made significant contributions to the improvement of the built environment. Contributions include, but are not limited to, the advancement or development of laws, regulations, policies or initiatives that promote excellence in architecture; the commissioning of notable additions to the built environment that are of benefit to all; or activities that raise the public's consciousness of the importance of excellent design in shaping the appearance and quality of the environment we live in.

Eligibility

Any individual, institution, association, or company that is not practicing architecture is eligible to receive the AIA Triangle Isosceles Award if nominated by a member or associate member of AIA Triangle.

Selection

An awards panel assembled by the AIA Triangle Awards Committee will be responsible for reviewing the nominations and selecting recipients. The number of recipients in any one year is the discretion of the awards panel.

Nomination Requirements

1. Deadline for nominations is Monday, 02 March 2009.
2. Only nominations received from members or associate members of AIA Triangle will be accepted.
3. Any prompt method of delivery is acceptable. Mail-in nominations must show postmark or other evidence of being en route by midnight 02 March 2009. Hand-delivered nominations must be received by end of business day 02 March 2009.

5. Nominations must be submitted using the attached AIA Triangle Isosceles Award nomination form. A separate form must be used for each nominee. Each form submitted must be complete in order to be eligible for consideration to the award. During the selection process, the nominator may be contacted to help provide additional information about the nominee.
